

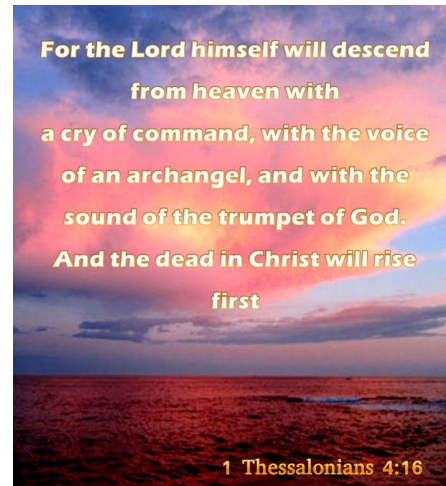

- ✚ **Holy Communion** is offered at all services. All baptized believers who recognize the presence of Christ in the bread and wine are welcome at his table. Those who have not taken first communion instruction are invited forward for a blessing.
- ✚ **Attendance Cards:** We ask everyone to fill out the enclosed card and drop it into one of the offering plates. If you are a guest, please consider giving us a full mailing address, email, and phone number.
- ✚ **Please remember to silence cell phones and pagers.**
- ✚ **Quiet Offering** is taken during worship for the support of a variety of designated ministries outside of St. Luke's.
- ✚ **Large print bulletins and hearing devices:** available from the ushers. An induction loop is provided for the benefit of hearing aid users. To use, just switch your hearing aid to 'T'.
- ✚ **Childcare:** a nursery for infants and toddlers through two years old is available during Sunday worship services. Nursery is located across from the office, to the left of the sanctuary.
- ✚ **Children's Church** for those three to five years old is available during the sermon (11:00). Children leave the sanctuary on a "lifeline" after the Children's Message and return during the Sharing of the Peace.

Gluten-free wafers and grape juice are available on a tray at the center aisle. (We take great care to limit cross-contamination, but we cannot guarantee they are completely safe for those with celiac disease.) **Form two lines** on each side, receiving the wine either by intinction (the glass chalice) or by drinking (the ceramic chalice). Those preferring **grape juice** move to the server in the middle.*
